

**Colonel Brian R. Haebig** enlisted in the United States Army in 1985. Following basic training he attended Officer Candidate School at Fort Benning, Georgia where he was commissioned an Infantry second lieutenant. Following the Infantry officer basic course, airborne and Ranger training, he was assigned to the 1-9th and 1-506th Infantry Battalions at Camp Greaves, Korea. There he served for two years as Rifle Platoon Leader, Support Platoon Leader, Combat Support Company XO and Battalion Maintenance Officer. He returned to CONUS and attended the Infantry Officer Advance Course followed by advanced training at Fort Lee, VA to familiarize him to his new branch – Quartermaster. His first assignment as a logistician was the 82nd Airborne Division's Logistics Automation Officer supporting



Operations JUST CAUSE and DESERT SHIELD/DESERT STORM. After returning from the Gulf War, he assumed command of the Headquarters Support Company, 407th S&T Battalion and later was the first Battalion S3 for the newly formed 407th Forward Support Battalion. From April 1994 to August 1995, he was assigned to the 7th Special Operations Support Command located at Panzer Kaserne, Stuttgart, Germany where he served as the Operations Officer and Planner for Army Special Operation Forces entering EUCOM's area of responsibility. From August 1995 to June 1998 he was assigned to the U.S. Army Officer of Military Support in Washington DC as the unit's Support Operations Officer. From 1999 to 2001 he was the Executive Officer, Support Squadron, 1SFOD-Delta located at Fort Bragg, North Carolina; followed by a Joint tour as an Airborne Battle Staff Logistics Planner aboard US Strategic Command's Airborne Command Post (LOOKING GLASS) located at Offutt Air Force Base, Omaha, Nebraska through 2003. He assumed command of the 524th Corps Support Battalion at Schofield Barracks, HI in 2003 and deployed his Logistics Task Force to Afghanistan (OEF V) from February 2004 – March 2005. Following command, he served as the XO for LTG John Brown, Commander, US Army, Pacific at Fort Shafter, Hawaii. After returning to CONUS in August 2006, he briefly served as the Quartermaster / Chemical Enlisted Branch Chief. In January 2007 he was deployed to Kabul, Afghanistan to command the Headquarters Support Group for the International Security Assistance Force. After returning from Afghanistan, he attended the Industrial College of the Armed Forces at Fort McNair, DC. COL Haebig holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Wisconsin – Oshkosh and a Master's degree from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces. His military education includes the Infantry Officer Basic and Advance Course, Petroleum Officer Course, Supply and Service Manager Course, Combined Arms Staff Services School, Army Command and General Staff Officers Course and the Joint Forces Staff College. His awards and decorations include the Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal (3OLC), Meritorious Service Medal (1OLC), Air Force Aerial Achievement Medal (1OLC), Army Commendation Medal (3OLC), Army Achievement Medal (1OLC) and the Joint Meritorious Unit Award, National Defense Service Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, NATO Medal, and the Kuwait Liberation Medal. He wears the Ranger Tab, Combat Action Badge, Expert Infantryman's Badge, Jumpmaster, Air Assault, Aviation Crewmember and Parachute Rigger Badge and Foreign Jump Wings from Israel, Germany and Australia.
